Search of Water

It is critical to establish at the outset of an incident if there is a realistic prospect of survivability and every reasonable effort must be made to achieve a rescue. It is accepted that for immersion incidents involving total head under submersion in water colder than 6 Celsius survival is possible for up to 90 minutes, particularly where the victim is a child.

Good practice dictates that where the location of the incident is identified it is marked as a GPS way point or grid reference, if this facility is available, or, if possible, using a marker buoy. This will allow formulation of a more focused search plan taking account of prevailing water and weather conditions.

Media Liaison / Briefing

Agencies will work together to provide a single codified media message. A Media Liaison Centre will be selected that is suitable for the incident circumstances, this will be used to coordinate the multi-agency media response.
